Aboriginal art - Children will practise a variety of skills to create an original piece of aboriginal art.

DT

Mechanics - children will have a go at creating pop up books using different mechanisms

PE - Outdoor Athletics and Netball

Children will take part in outdoor athletics sessions where they develop their skills of running, jumping and throwing. Challenges will be individual and team based. Children will also continue Netball where we will focus on small sided games and in particular how to attack and defend effectively.

Science

Reflective Light - Children will learn about how light works when it reflects or deflects off of a variety of materials.

Managing change:

Children will discover strategies for dealing with change.

Beginning and belonging:

Children will learn where we are and why?

Maths Multiplication & division -Recall and use

multiplication and division facts for the 4, 4 and 8x tables

-Write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables that they know, including for two-digit numbers times one-digit numbers, using mental and progressing to formal written methods.

Fractions: Children will be able to represent fractions in a variety of different ways. They will add and subtract fractions and be able to simplify fractions. They will learn to order fractions.

Time: Children will learn to tell the time to the minute, 5 minutes and to the hour. They will learn about roman numerals and reading analog and digital.

Measurement - Money: Add and subtract amounts of money to give change using both £ and p in practical contexts.

Statistics: Solve one and two step questions (e'g 'how many more?' and 'how many fewer?') using information presented in scaled bar charts and pictograms and tables.

English - Aboriginal dreamtime stories - Fiction.

Children will learn about traditional aboriginal folktales called dreamtime. They will read 'How the Kaola got a stumpy tail', 'How the birds got their colours' and 'How the kangaroo got their long tails.'

They will be writing their own version of these stories.

Non- Fiction - Autobiographies

Children will research a variety of autobiographies and biographies and discover the differences.

They will read 'The boy who touched the stars' and by the end of the unit, they will write a biography on a famous figure.

Non-Fiction - Adverts

Children will learn the writing techniques used in advertising. They will use a range of persuasive language so that they can create their very own advert.

Poetry - Colour poetry.

Children will read a variety of colour poems, and create their own.

History - Ancient civilisations:

Children will learn about four main ancient dynasties: The Sumers, the Chang dynasty, the Indo valley and the Ancient Egyptians.
